Ceremonial events, speeches and activities will be held at Mercy Hospital for Women in Heidelberg and Werribee Mercy Hospital, reflecting the focus for this year's NAIDOC Week theme, "Songlines – The living narrative of our nation."

Celebrated nationally, NAIDOC Week encourages Australians to acknowledge Indigenous history and recognise the contributions Indigenous Australians make to the country and its society.

Mercy Health Group Executive Officer Adjunct Professor Stephen Cornelissen said the organisation will host a series of accessible events and activities so patients and residents can participate in the celebration.
